CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS AS PROPOSED BY WSCF EXCO AND 2 SCMs FOR VOTATION BY AFFILIATED MOVEMENTS IN ON-LINE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

BACKGROUND

The Executive Committee of WSCF has approved the proposed constitutional amendments set out below for submission to the affiliated movements to vote on, in an on-line General Assembly.

The problems to be addressed by the proposed amendments, namely structural and financial problems, were identified by the Future of the Federation Task Group (FoF) in the Bogota Assembly of WSCF.

The work of the FoF Task Group was continued by the Transition Team formed after the Bogota Assembly. The Transition Team reported to the Executive Committee meeting of 14 – 15 December 2015 in Sicily. The Executive Committee approved the amendments set out below, seeking that the proposed amendments be voted on by the affiliated movements in an online General Assembly, given that constitutional amendments need to be approved in a General Assembly.

The Exco does not believe that the proposed amendments should await the next General Assembly, which is several years away. Nor does WSCF have the funds to convene an in-person extraordinary meeting to consider the proposed amendments.

The amendments are proposed in order to ensure that the mission of WSCF can continue with vigour and vitality and in ways that are financially sustainable.

There are two major underlying principles guiding the WSCF ExCo in proposing these amendments. First, these proposed amendments aims to make sustainable the decision making structure of the Federation by ensuring full democratic participation of all within the structural guidelines of the WSCF Constitution, and without losing the benefits of in person meeting for community building and equal possibility of participation, especially taking into account barriers related to language (multiple language translation) and access to ICT infrastructures and connectivity.

Second, the proposed amendments likewise find ways to make the governance and the administration of the Federation more efficient, accountable and following professional standards of operations while keeping the core leadership structure and its decision-making "for student, led by student".

You will recall that earlier in 2016 every movement was asked whether the movement wished to propose any other constitutional amendments. Movements were encouraged to refrain if at all possible from suggesting ohter amendments if these could await the next Genral Assembly. Most

movements chose not to propose further amendments, but two movements did make such proposals, SCM Hong Kong and SCM Norway. Copies of their introductory rationales are attached to these papers for your consideration or will be send to you directly by them (SCM of Norway). In brief, the SCM of Hong Kong is concerned to maximise gender equity in participation in the life of the federation, institutionalising on-line General Assemblies for all purposes, not just constitutional amendment and to hold a General Assembly every four years,. The SCM Norway would like to have staff nominated, evaluated and appointed by the Executive Committee, all located in a central office, have the Executive Committee responsible for determining regional budgets and any monies available to the Federation as a whole for national movements to be allocated by the Executive Committee (not regional committees) to national movements.

If both Executive Committee and proxy positions fall vacant, the concerned Regional Committee nominates replacements from amongst Regional Committee members.

Any two of the above named persons shall have the power to authorise other persons, chosen by them to act jointly or singly on behalf of the Federation in fields circumscribed in the power of attorney. The contracts of the Staff shall be signed by two of the Officers.
